

On the 19th November 2020 we received confirmation from the Frenchville Sports Club that we are able to conduct general meetings in the FSC Function Room for a maximum of 180 people. We have reviewed the Frenchville Sports Club Covid Plan and Function Room layout plan in conjunction with U3A Network Covid Safe Plan and have prepared a Risk Assessment and Covid Safe Plan to ensure we have a safe return to general meetings.

The first of these meetings will be on the 7th December 2020, and as long as the Covid situation in Queensland does not change and the December general meeting occurs without incident, your committee will commence planning for the Activities Expo on 1st February 2021 and the AGM on the 1st March 2021. Our members should be aware that the resumption of general meetings will not be “business as usual”. We have made adjustments to comply with the strict Covid requirements such as social distancing, room layout, morning teas, and duration of meeting.

We have been working with many of our activity coordinators to restart their activities. So far

13 activities have resumed after assistance with risk assessments and Covid Safe Plans and where necessary, providing sanitisers and cleaning products.

If any activity coordinator believes it might be possible to restart an activity, contact the Activities Manager Phil Morisette who can make arrangements for assistance to look at your activity and see if we can provide someone to assist with a Risk Assessment and Covid Safe Plan that will allow the activity to resume.

We are rapidly approaching the March 2021 AGM. Now is the time for our members to consider taking a position on the management committee because many of the current committee members, including myself, will be stepping down from our current positions in March 2021 after completing a three year term. This is an opportunity for members to nominate for a position, including President, on the committee and take U3A Rockhampton to the next level, making the organisation an interesting, enjoyable and safe place for our members.

Nomination forms can be downloaded from the U3A Rockhampton and District Inc web site <http://www.u3arockhampton.org.au/images/Nominformoct19.pdf> and will also be available at the December 2020 general meeting and February 2021 Activities Expo meeting. Completed forms are to be given to the Secretary by 15th February in readiness for the AGM.

A reminder that December is the time to renew your 2021 membership. Please put your fees and renewal form in an envelope with your name printed on it and hand to the Treasurer, or alternatively your renewal can be paid by EFT but if you forget to put your name in the description field, the Treasurer will not know who deposited the money. A Safety Sub-Committee consisting of 3 members from the management committee and 4 members from our membership have been busy for the last couple of months finalising the Risk Assessment and Incident Investigation Forms. They have one task left to complete and that is the training module for the committee and the activity coordinators. This is expected to be finalised prior to March 2021.

On behalf of myself and my management committee, I wish all of our U3A Rockhampton members a safe and happy Xmas and will see everyone in the New Year.

September and October certainly kicked off with a bang, with a multitude of events and announcements. You may have noticed in the media recently that CQUniversity is looking to consolidate its two Rockhampton campuses.

CQUniversity is seeking \$49.8 million to build the Central Queensland Tafe Centre of Excellence at the Rockhampton North campus. Prior to the Queensland State Election, both major electoral parties committed their support to the project which will see increased employment during construction and long term.

This new facility will cater to the growing needs of the region by providing education and training to an additional 2500 apprentices and VET students a year by 2030. Not only will this new centre provide additional training, but it will also be equipped with new and specialised equipment relevant to modern training standards.

In other important news, two years in the making, CQUniversity has announced it will officially partner with the University of Queensland (UQ), Central Queensland Hospital and Health Service (CQHHS) and Wide Bay Hospital and Health Service (WBHHS) to train up to 40 doctors in regional Queensland each year. Students will complete a three-year Bachelor of Medical Science (Pathway to Medicine) course with CQUniversity, before transitioning into UQ's four-year MD program – both offered and delivered in the local area. The first intake will occur in Rockhampton and Bundaberg in Term 1 2022, with students progressing to the UQ program in 2025.

This exciting partnership allows students to study and train locally without needing to move to a big city.


In 2019, CQUniversity was approached by Great Keppel Island (GKI) Hideaway for assistance with enhancing environmentally sustainable

practices. CQUniversity saw this as a mutually beneficial opportunity and seized it with both hands by exploring the possibility and identifying distinctive educational and research opportunities for students and staff.

In March 2020, CQUniversity's Office of Education Strategy and Innovation and I looked to confirm this joint partnership in writing by signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Great Keppel Island Hideaway. Unfortunately, due to the restrictions associated with COVID-19 the plans were put on hold. Six months later, on Wednesday, 7 October 2020, CQUniversity and GKI Hideaway finally put pen to paper signing the official MOU

This event saw staff and students participate in fieldwork activities including tree planting, animal trappings and tree carbon monitoring. This unique partnership was designed to support CQUniversity's Strategic Plan and underlines the commitment to community and industry engagement.

In other news, I had the pleasure of attending the dedication ceremony of the Rockhampton Men's Shed structure at the Rockhampton North campus. The Rockhampton Men's Shed is a fantastic community organisation who work tirelessly to improve the lives of local men and women. CQUniversity is a proud supporter of this organisation who have been based on the Rockhampton North campus since 2014. The newly constructed shed is part one of a three-part construction funded by The Iwasaki Foundation, Hopkin's Brothers and Caves Quarry. The structure was officially named The Iwasaki Foundation Shed. I look forward to seeing the progress of stage two and three.



This is still our major "activity" so we should be now able to continue into 2021, using this facility to keep our members in touch and informed as well as socially connected, if only at a 1.5mt distance.


At our March Meeting 90% of the present committee will retire and it will give you a chance to put your nomination forward to bring new ideas and

WRITING FOR PLEASURE.

Christmas 1954 Argyle Station The Kimberley.

1954 is a year which I will always remember. My father and Mother and Myself were living in an old but well preserved house which was the homestead of Argyle Downs. until a few years ago, had been the home of the Durack family.

My Father had been carrying out work at the station – installing pumps and other equipment in an effort to modernise the pumping and water reticulation to a variety of locations on the property.

I had just turned twelve. A free spirit, as I roamed the homestead paddock in a world of excitement and adventure. I knew that Christmas was approaching and that this year Santa wouldn't be calling. There were just no shops we were truly in the Never Never.

We had been in the Kimberley for almost a year. Dad had a contract with The Peel River Land and Mineral Company and we moved between their properties Carrying out work on their four stations. My expectations of Christmas presents had been dampened a few months earlier when Dad had seen me running along the dirt airstrip at Auvergne. I had been towing a small truck made from pieces of my Meccano set. He pulled me up and suggested that at twelve years of age I was getting too old to play with toys.

So here I was. Christmas day had arrived and I was set to get dressed and continue my usual habit of wandering around, investigating the night paddock to view any horses brought in for the night.

Getting out of bed I almost tipped a pillow case off the end. Puzzled as to what this was I sat back down to investigate.

Even now, seventy years later, when I think of that morning my eyes fill with tears. There in the pillow case was a Kodak 127 camera complete with a roll of film sent to me from Auvergne by the manager's wife. Accompanying the camera, was a beautiful red photo album from my parents. As I delved further to the bottom of the linen sack, I unearthed a book. The book was Treasure Island by Robert Louis Stevenson and it was given to me by Mr. and Mrs. Hooper. The Hooper's lived in a cottage just outside the home paddock. Mr Hooper was the company accountant and took care of the paperwork and record keeping for the four Kimberley properties.

Thank- you Mr. and Mrs .Hooper. Your wonderful gift brought many hours of reading enjoyment to a little boy, and along with Enid Blyton and Captain W.E. Johns, your treasured gift helped to create a love of reading which has bolstered my limited education provided by the established schools.



Today when I woke up I saw a mouse and it was dead.

**Safety Sub Committee Report

During the last postal vote a question was asked as to who would be willing to put their hands up to form a Safety Sub-committee. Subsequently, a sub-committee was formed consisting of three members of the executive committee and four members from the general U3A Rockhampton membership. This group reports its progress to the Management Committee.

We were tasked with scrutinizing all of the safety management, policy, forms, instructions and training with a view to improve and simplify the understanding of all things pertaining to safety within the Rockhampton Branch of U3A. We have been diligently working towards that aim and at this stage have successfully completed the management, policy,

forms and instructions. We are still working towards completing the training aspects of the task. This includes the development of the training courses and, when completed, we will commence training activity coordinators to enable them to develop a better understand and to be able to implement the policies and procedures.

Further to our remit, it was decided that we would be available to assist coordinators and members tasked with the preparation of Risk Assessment Forms. If you are new to this task, it can be quite daunting, and a little assistance, if required, can help you on the way to completing a successful form to submit to the Management Committee for approval.

The forms are available on your "U3A Rockhampton and District Inc." web site. The URL is "u3arockhampton.org.au". Look very near the top of the home page and you will see "SAFETY Management". Click on this link and you will be taken to the Safety Management Policy and Procedures, Instructions and forms area. If it is a Risk Assessment Form you require, simply click on the form and download a copy to your computer. Fill out the form either with a pen or a PDF editing program such as Adobe Acrobat Reader DC or Adobe Acrobat Editor, then post it via email to u3arockhampton@hotmail.com, or print it and snail mail to P O Box 8160, Allenstown, Rockhampton Qld, 4700 to your Management Committee for approval. If you choose to fill the document out with a pen, the Management Committee will arrange to have it typed up, and then sent back to the author for their approval prior to Management Committee approval.

We are here to help members with all things pertaining to safety, so please, ask for help via your Activities Manager or any of the executive committee. They will quickly get in touch with someone from this sub-committee and we will contact you ASAP and hopefully we will be able to sort out your query.

Remember, if you are struggling and require help preparing a Risk Assessment, please ask for help.


